### **EVERGLADES LITERACY**



Our second grade students learned about alligator holes and why alligators are so important to the Everglades and the animals who call the Everglades home!





Second grade classes learned about the Wood Stork and how it is affected by the wet season in the Everglades The classes held a relay race where one group took "fish" to their nest during dry season and the other during wet season.
