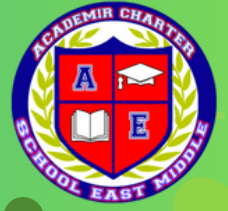

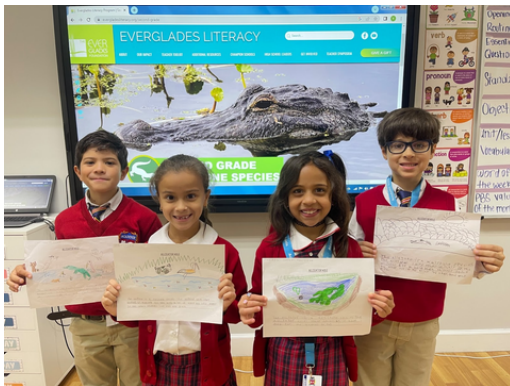

EVERGLADES LITERACY



Our second grade students learned about alligator holes and why alligators are so important to the Everglades and the animals who call the Everglades home!



Second grade classes learned about the Wood Stork and how it is affected by the wet season in the Everglades. The classes held a relay race where one group took "fish" to their nest during dry season and the other during wet season.



Third grade read about different habitats and the animals that live there. They answered questions with text evidence to support their answers.

After reading about the different animal groups, students were able to classify them based on their characteristics.
