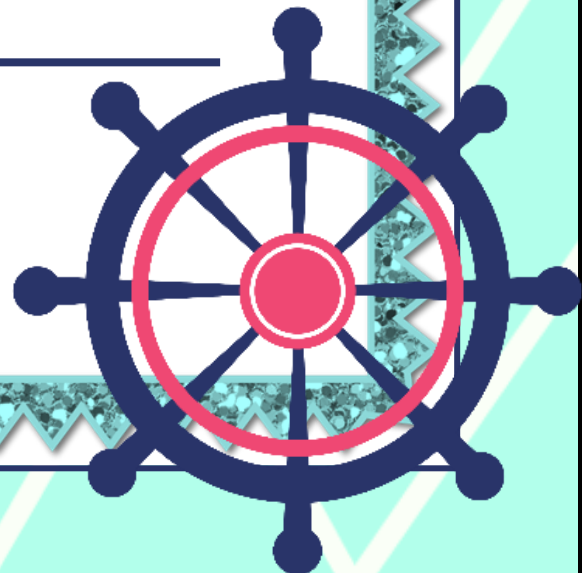

In preparation for the 2026–2027 school year and to support continued academic growth, the curriculum team at AcadeMir Charter Schools has developed grade-level summer learning assignments designed to help prevent the “summer slide” and keep students academically engaged throughout the summer months. Estimados Padres y Tutores:

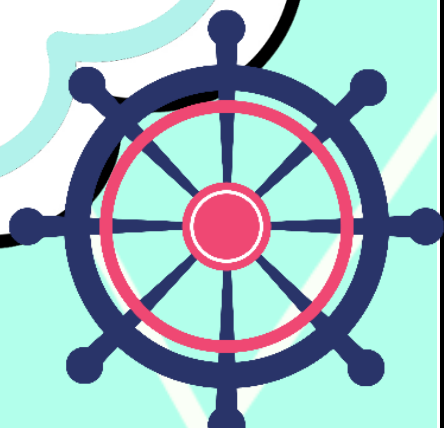


